## Summary of Findings

CAWP examined a total of 63 boards and commissions in New Jersey, which have a total of 613 members. These 63 include all boards and commissions requiring financial disclosure, plus certain other boards and commissions with high levels of responsibility (all listed on the following sheets).* The numbers and percentages below are of the 63 boards and commissions examined only (and thus DO NOT reflect the numbers of all the boards and commissions in the state).

## Of the 63 boards and commissions CAWP examined*:

- 27 of them ( $43 \%$ ) had a proportion of women below $15 \%$.
- 6 of them ( $10 \%$ ) had no women serving at all.
- 23 of them ( $37 \%$ ) had only one woman serving.
