Summary of Findings

CAWP examined a total of **63** boards and commissions in New Jersey, which have a total of **613** members. These 63 include all boards and commissions requiring financial disclosure, plus certain other boards and commissions with high levels of responsibility (all listed on the following sheets).* The numbers and percentages below are of the 63 boards and commissions examined only (and thus **DO NOT** reflect the numbers of all the boards and commissions in the state).

Summary of Findings (cont.)

Of the 63 boards and commissions CAWP examined*:

- 27 of them (43%) had a proportion of women below 15%.
- 6 of them (10%) had no women serving at all.
- 23 of them (37%) had only one woman serving.
